- During the day, there's the Igloofête for young and old to enjoy electronic music with the whole family.



- To combat the cold, visitors can sip caribou, a typically Québécois drink made with wine, whisky and maple

- In Lake Louise, you can skate on the lake with its many ice sculptures at Ice Magic.
